

- i. Healing the daughter of Jairus
 - ii. The healing of the woman with a flow of blood (an example of an intercalation). He calls her “daughter”
- 2. Jesus sends The Twelve out, feeds the multitude, walks on water, and encounters more misunderstanding.(6:7-8:21)
 - a. John the Baptist killed by Herod Antipas
 - b. OT echoes in the feeding of the multitudes...the wilderness wanderings. John will make this definite by setting the feeding during Passover.

The Transitional Bridge (8:21-10:52)

- 1. The Healing of the First Blind Man & 3 Passion Predictions
 - a. The scene at Caesarea Philippi
 - i. Who do people say that I am?
 - ii. Who do you say that I am
 - iii. Jesus defines Himself as the Messiah who will suffer
 - iv. Peter shows his misunderstanding in his rebuke of Jesus
 - v. Jesus rebukes Peter and continues to teach about the nature of His Messiah-ship and their discipleship.
 - b. The Transfiguration
 - i. Its relationship to what has just preceded

- ii. The meaning of it: the figures of Moses and Elijah
 - iii. The disciples are to listen to Jesus just as they listened to the Law and the Prophets.
- c. Jesus predicts His passion for the second time and again the disciples misunderstand
- d. The third prediction of the suffering/James and John misunderstand.
- e. Jesus self-understanding which is the true understanding of Jesus Messiah. He came to serve and to give his life-disciples must reflect this in their lives.
- f. The second healing of the blind man closes the inclusio.
 - i. The disciples are blind to who Jesus is
 - ii. Like the first blind man they will need a second touch to “see”. That will come when they see Jesus die and raised.
